### **General Resources**

- **Network for Good** (www.networkforgood.org) has a lot of resources for nonprofits around technology and is updated frequently.
- **TechSoup** (www.techsoup.org) also is a general resource center for nonprofits seeking to incorporate technology into their work.

#### **Discounted Software**

These organizations provide software for free or for reduced cost to any nonprofit organization. You can also approach software companies directly. Many of them have donation programs.

#### **Recycled Hardware**

#### **In-Kind Contributions**

- Through the <u>Compag Contributions Program (www.compaq.com/corporate</u>) nonprofits can apply for in-kind and cash grants for technology
- <u>Conservation Technology Support Program (www.ctsp.org)</u> awards hardware and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) software to conservation organizations.
- <u>Environmental Support Center (http://www.envsc.org/)</u> subsidizes training and donates hardware and software to environmental organizations.
- <u>Hewlett-Packard (www.webcenter.hp.com)</u> donates equipment to nonprofits and educational institutions in various issue areas including arts and culture, civic and environment, and health and human services.
